

### **English – Fairy Tales**

Children will listen to and join in with the repeated lines from a range of different of traditional tales including Little Red Riding Hood and The Three Little Pigs. Children will contrast different versions of the same story and use role play to understand character and plot. They will write statements, questions and exclamations and work on producing a new version of a well known story. Children will punctuate their sentences, using capital letters accurately. Non-Fiction work will focus on information texts about wolves!

### **Mathematics - Year 1**

Counting in tens from 10 then from any number, find ten more and ten less than any 2 digit number. Finding bonds to 7,8,and 9 and doubles to 10. Adding 3 numbers and finding totals of 2 and 3 coins. Know the value of each coin to £1. Compare weights using non standard units and tell the time to the 1/2 hour. Recognise odd and even numbers and find half of numbers up to 20. Find differences in lengths and name and describe 3D shapes.

### **Science – Everyday Materials**

Children will be taught to distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made. They will learn to name and identify a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal water and rock. Children will learn to describe the simple physical properties of materials and compare and group them. Pupils will work scientifically performing simple tests to explore questions such as what is the best material for Red Riding Hood's cloak?

### **Key Vocabulary**

Materials, properties, hard, soft, stretchy, stiff, shiny, dull, bendy, rigid, rough, smooth, waterproof, absorbent, opaque, transparent group, sort, classify, compare, similarities, differences.

### **Phonics and Spelling**

Children will revise the consonant and vowel digraphs and trigraphs they have been taught and the sounds which they represent. We will add the prefix un to the beginnings of words to change their meanings and learn to spell compound words such as football, farmyard, blackberry and bedroom. Children will continue learning how to spell the common exception words and these will be tested each week.

## **SPRING TERM 2018 ROSEWOOD CLASS ONCE UPON A TIME**

### **R.E. AMV- Rules & Choices**

Children will talk about times when their behaviour has affected others. They will identify codes of behaviour that people may be guided by. The second half term will focus on Salvation – What is Easter?

### **Design Technology/Art**

Make paper plate 'wolf' masks.  
Make gingerbread men biscuits.  
Collage pictures of fairytale settings and characters.  
Colour and colour mixing paint/pastels.

### **Physical Education – Mr Brewer**

Children will have two sessions of PE each week. This term will focus on gymnastics and netball the following half term.

### **Humanities & PHSE**

In History, children will be finding out about the prolific fairy tale writer Hans Christian Anderson. They will research his early life, where he lived, (Denmark) and what he looked like. They will think of their own questions to ask and answer. We will watch parts of a DVD about his life.

In Geography, children will be using atlases and world maps to identify the United Kingdom and its countries. They will learn about the world's seven continents and five oceans before locating Denmark in Europe. PHSE will focus on the valuable lessons we can learn from fairy tales, such as honesty, trust, acting appropriately and being responsible.

### **Music – Fairy tale worlds.**

Children will learn to use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes linked to fairytales. They will explore Peter and the Wolf by Prokofiev.

### **Role Play- Grandma's Cottage**

Children will have the opportunity to re-enact the story of Little Red Riding Hood and later the 3 Little Pigs using masks and props. They will be encouraged to retell the story, knowing the repeating lines used by different characters e.g. – "Grandma, what big ears you have! "
